Researchers investigating various aspects of care coordination will speak about the progress of their research, and there will be ample opportunity for dialogue and networking, exploring improvements for the clinical team, family and friends, and most importantly - the patient experience.

Participants will also be introduced to resources for more complex assessments, and an outline of the provision of MAID, with a focus on the community setting.
