CARE COORDINATION WORKSHOP - MODELS, CHALLENGES AND SOLUTIONS

Target Audiences: Nursing, Social Workers, and Administrative Teams

Course Description: Join with your colleagues from across the country to learn about one another's programs in coordinating patients, assessors and providers in medical assistance in dying. Discuss the benefits of various models of support, as well as common challenges and innovative solutions in this new and dynamic field of health services delivery. Researchers investigating various aspects of care coordination will speak about the progress of their research, and there will be ample opportunity for dialogue and networking, exploring improvements for the clinical team, family and friends, and - most importantly - the patient experience.

Participants will also be introduced to resources for more complex assessments, and an outline of the provision of MAiD, with a focus on the community setting.
