Any medical staff that received their first and second dose prior to April 3, 2021 will likely need to update their immunization status by using the record submission form available at:

• ImmunizeBC is our source of truth for medical staff vaccination status.



 Prior to April 3, Island Health was utilizing CERNER to capture who had been vaccinated. Consistent with provincial orders, there are many medical staff that would have received their first and more than likely their second dose before <u>https://immunizebc.ca/</u> went live.
