- <u>Updated: Order of the Provincial Health Officer: Hospital and Community</u>
 <u>COVID-19 Vaccination Status Information and Preventive Measures</u>

 Updates include changes to Section A, additional information added to Section C (Vaccination Status Information), Section D (Post-secondary Institutions), (Exemption requests and approvals) and more.
- <u>Updated: Vaccination Aftercare Document</u>

 Updates include information in the "things to remember" section which includes: It will take 2-3 weeks after getting the 1st dose to build immunity to the virus. Additional

doses will take several days. For the best protection, get all the recommended doses. Continue to follow public health guidelines.

• <u>Updated: COVID-19 Vaccination Clinical Guidance</u>

This document provides guidance regarding frequently asked questions related to clinical aspects of COVID-19 vaccination. Question #4: Clarification on booster dose eligibility, prioritization and timing.

• <u>Vaccine Safety for Youth: 5 things to know for 12-17 year olds</u>

This document explains vaccine safety for youth between 12-17 years old. Over two million youth in Canada and over 250,000 youth in B.C. have already received a dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. Vaccinated youth are much less likely to get sick from COVID-19 or be hospitalized.

Updated modeling includes information on Geographic distribution of COVID 19 case rates by local health area of residence, Geographic distribution of COVID 19 vaccinations by local/ community health area of residence, Rate of cases and hospitalizations by vaccination status, Daily case rate by age is shared and more.

- <u>Updated: Overview of Visitors in Acute Care (Ministry of Health)</u>
 Effective Monday, November 8, 2021, visitors to Island Health hospitals will need to
 - be fully vaccinated, and show proof of vaccination, to enter.
 - <u>Updated poster: Visitor Restrictions Are in Effect to reflect new</u>
 mandates in facilities
- <u>Updated: Mask Use in Health Care Facilities During the COVID-19 Pandemic</u>
 This policy was updated to reflect that people age 5 and older should wear masks inside health care facilities.
- <u>Updated Poster: Guidelines for Visitors to LTC and Seniors' AL Facilities</u>
 Updated to reflect the current vaccination protocols. Does not apply to children who are ineligible for the vaccine, those with an approved medical exemption or for an end-of-life visit.
- Respectful Distancing in Waiting Areas
 Terminology shifting from 'physical distancing' to 'respectful distancing'.
