<u>Province strengthens COVID-19 measures for safer holiday season</u>
 Our Provincial Health Officer is implementing additional measures to address

rising COVID-19 case counts in order to avoid an increase in hospitalizations and critical care admissions and subsequent stress on the health system.

• <u>Premier's statement on federal travel advisory</u>

Premier John Horgan has issued this recommendation in response to the December 15th federal travel advisory: "I urge British Columbians to follow the federal government's advice to avoid non-essential travel outside the country. As the highly transmissible Omicron variant spreads worldwide, this is not a time to take chances."

<u>Province introduces new COVID-19 measures for safer holiday season</u>

To address rising COVID-19 case counts and keep people safe, the Provincial Health Officer is issuing revised orders, which take effect on Monday, Dec. 20, 2021. Measures will extend to Jan. 31, 2022, at 11:59 p.m.

<u>Post COVID-19 Recovery Clinic – New Referral Form</u>

A Post-COVID-19 Recovery Clinic (PCRC) is opening in early 2022 at the Royal Jubilee Hospital. The PCRC is a sister clinic of the four already functioning PCRC programs on the mainland. This clinic will offer both in-person and virtual care to all Vancouver Island residents experiencing chronic symptoms more than 12 weeks after their acute infectious COVID-19 episode. The referral form is available on Pathways and should NOT be used to refer patients who require urgent COVID-19 clinical care.

<u>New: Disseminated Strongyloidiasis Guidance</u>
 BC COVID Therapeutics Committee (CTC) issued a Clinical Practice Guide
 for Assessment and Prevention of Disseminated Strongyloidiasis in patients

hospitalized with COVID-19.

• <u>The rapy in Adult Pregnant Patients with COVID 19</u>

Clinical guidance from the BC COVID-19 Therapeutics Committee focuses on therapy uses for pregnant patients who have COVID-19 and are inpatients in either the ICU or ward, or are Ambulatory outpatients.

• <u>Self-register for the third-dose with Immunize BC</u>.

If you haven't yet identified as a health-care worker with ImmunizeBC, first make sure you are registered in the <u>www.getvaccinated.gov.bc.ca</u> system, then self-

identify as a health-care worker using this link [<u>www.getvaccinated.gov.bc.ca/s/d3-</u> target-self-identification] and access code: <u>Y6383E!</u>

 <u>Update to Communicable Disease Control Manual, Chapter 2: Immunization,</u> <u>Part 4 – Biological Products</u>

Booster dose eligibility has been updated to include people temporarily or permanently residing/working in an Indigenous community. Footnote A has been added to indicate that a 0.5 mL dose of AstraZeneca vaccine should only be offered as a booster dose if a COVID-19 mRNA vaccine is contraindicated or inaccessible, or if the client refuses an mRNA vaccine. <u>World Health Organization Emergency Use Authorization Qualified COV ID-19</u>
 <u>Vaccines</u>

Updated to include Covovax: This document is intended to provide health care providers with approaches for individuals who have received COVID-19 vaccination outside of Canada. The WHO list of EUA qualified COVID-19 vaccines will be updated over time as additional COVID-19 vaccines receive emergency use listing, and as such, this document will be updated accordingly.
