• <u>What is going on with COVID-19?</u> Island Health guidance document on why it is still important to maintain the layers of protection that we have come to know through this pandemic; for some people COVID-19 can still be a serious disease.



- <u>Children under 5 years now eligible to register to receive the COVID-19 vaccine</u> Beginning August 2, 2022, all people over the age of 6 months in B.C. can now receive protection against the COVID-19 virus, following Health Canada's appr oval of the vaccine specifically formulated for children between the ages of 6 months and five years old.
- <u>B.C.'s COVID-19 immunization plan continues with fall booster</u> Government of B.C. update on how people in B.C. can look ahead to their next

COVID-19 vaccine dose with the announcement of a fall booster program as the next step in its COVID-19 immunization plan.

 Updated BCCDC guidance on managing the interaction between apixaban and nirmatrelvir/ritonavir. Most resources now support drug modifications for the duration of nirmatrelvir/ritonavir treatment and 2 additional days after the treatment finishes (as opposed to 3).

- <u>Update to Communicable Disease Control Manual, Chapter 2: Immunization,</u> <u>Part 4 – Biological Products & Appendix E – Management of Biologicals</u> BCCDC Guidance Manual updated for COVID-19 Vaccine Eligibility: A new product page has been developed for the Comirnaty® (Pfizer-BioNTech) Adult/Adolescent vaccine supplied with a gray vial cap and gray border around the vial. Content related to reported rates of myocarditis under Adverse Events has been updated (Pfizer-BioNTech).
- <u>COVID-19 Therapies tixagevimab/cilgavimab (EVUSHELD™) Guidance</u> <u>Documents</u>

BCCDC guidance updates within the Health Care Provider Information document includes current recommendations for tixagevimab/cilgavimab in BC, and revised guidance regarding the use of tixagevimab/cilgavimab for pre-exposure prophylaxis against COVID-19 considering the predominance of the BA 4/5 Variants of Concern in BC.
