• Introduction to Decriminalization in British Columbia

On January 31, 2023, a three-year temporary exemption under the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act came into effect in BC. The exemption means people will not face criminal penalties for possessing small amounts of certain illicit drugs for personal use.
