Medical Leader Spotlight

For the Bulletin's last Medical Leader Spotlight of 2024, we are heading north. Dean Percy, MD MSc FRCSC is a general and trauma surgeon. Dr. Percy is also Site Medical Director and Chief of Staff at Campbell River Hospital.

Please outline your leadership role—why might a member of the medical staff at Campbell River Hospital reach out to you?

My role is a conduit between physicians and hospital management. This can mean helping to address specific problems physicians are encountering at work. I work closely with the Site Director to help ensure everything, and everyone, is functioning at the highest level possible to optimize patient care.

What would you like your medical staff colleagues to know or understand about your role, or your site?

Healthcare providers at our site, like in many other departments and services, are working hard to ensure that there are no gaps in coverage. We need more people in every aspect of healthcare on the Island, and while this is something being worked on at a higher level, healthcare leaders and providers on the ground need to support each other.

What is the best leadership advice you have been given, and how do you apply that in your role?

I have always tried to uphold the principle of 'Extreme Ownership'—a leader must take full responsibility for their team. This means creating a culture of admitting mistakes, curbing ego, and focusing on the success of the team rather that the success of the individual
