Physician Assistants Begin Work at Saanich Peninsula Hospital

BC's new Health Minister Josie Osborne was at Saanich Peninsula Hospital on January 8 to welcome the province's first two employed Physician Assistants. Working under the direct

supervision of Dr. Paeta Lehn, Medical Lead, Emergency; new recruits Eric Demers and Fred Bai are eager participants in this one-year pilot project.

In BC, Physician Assistants practice under the supervision of a physician to assess and treat patients. The pilot project is an important step in addressing some of the health human resource challenges that impact emergency departments throughout the province. At Island Health, finding ways to support medical staff in their work is imperative—Physician Assistants will play a key role in a patient's care team, while simultaneously helping to relieve some of the pressures on ED physicians. MAA extends a warm welcome to Mr. Demers and Mr. Bai.


