The Art Wellness Studios & Clinic (AWSC) delivers art therapy services designed to facilitate participants' exploration of diverse art-making techniques, fostering expanded modes of self-expression and promoting the development of wellness self- management skills. AWSC supports participants by promoting a sense of self-confidence, empowerment, individuality, self-direction, hope, and motivation. The group environment provides participants with opportunities for structured meaningful activity and the use of creativity to support emotional self-regulation. The group is facilitated by qualified art therapists who maintain safety and provide support.
