

Community Medical Director, Oceanside

Role Focus

The Community Medical Director, Oceanside is responsible for medical staff governance and clinical quality, consistent with Island Health's Medical Staff By-laws and Rules, Primary Care policies, and quality structures.

This Senior leadership role focuses on strengthening collaborative relationships between community and acute care settings, and with key organizational partners such as First Nation communities, Divisions of Family Practice, Primary Care Networks, long term care facilities, and primary care service organizations.

This role functions in a co-leadership model, which values shared accountability, joint decision-making, and the integration of medical and operational perspectives.

Key Impact Areas

In partnership with your co-lead, you will:

Operations:

- Oversee primary care and urgent care service delivery in Island Health owned and operated sites to ensure services are efficient, effective, and well-integrated.
- Ensure site-level procedures to maintain standards of appropriate continuity and results management and support primary care provider recruitment and scheduling in Island Health clinics without a designated medical lead.
- Manage primary care contracts within the community.
- Support the development and integration of new owned and operated primary care clinics and services (e.g. Urgent and Primary Care Centres).
- Support the integration of Primary Care Network (PCN) staff with community primary care.
- Provide medical leadership to enhance collaboration between local Community Health Services and primary care.
- Lead the assessment, monitoring, and forecasting of program resource needs.
- Support the administration of REEF to Urgent Care to avoid closures

Strategy:

- Lead strategic planning related to local Island Health owned and operated primary care services in collaboration with internal and external partners. Internal partners include Community Health Services (CHS), Mental Health & Substance Use (MHSU), Addictions Medicine & Substance Use (AMSU), and Public Health. External partners include Divisions of FP, PCNs, First Nations Health Authority (FNHA) and other primary care service organizations.
- Contribute to the development local workforce plans including development of strategy for alternate providers such as the Associate Physician program in Urgent Care.

- Clinical Services Plans that address current and emerging healthcare needs.

Governance:

- Address concerns related to professional behaviour and clinical competence of family physicians and nurse practitioners in Island-Health operated primary care clinics and services in accordance with Island Health policy.
- Support workforce recruitment and retention strategies for Primary Care and Urgent Care.
- Contribute to credentialing and privileging processes at hospital act sites in alignment with the Medical Staff Bylaws and Rules and Island Health policy.

Quality:

- Co-lead quality planning and prioritization through the local Community Quality and Operations Committee.
- Establish structures and processes that actively engage physicians and nurse practitioners in quality improvement and assurance activities.
- Support reviews of PCQO and PSLS files when medical leadership is required.

Communication & Collaboration:

- Promote a culture of collaboration and patient-centered care within the community.
- Represent Island Health and foster strong relationships with external partners, interest-holders, and the media, as directed.
- Ensure effective communication within your portfolio.
- Collaborate with Division of Family Practice and Primary Care Network leadership, Chiefs of Staff, Clinical Service Delivery leadership, and other leaders as needed.
- Engaging with external interest holders to address system-wide strategies, operational standardization, and operational challenges, as assigned.

- Exceptional verbal and written communication skills.
- Demonstrated ability to adapt to a dynamic healthcare environment with initiative and resilience.
- Strong interpersonal skills with the ability to build and sustain professional relationships at all levels.
- Proven clinical competence with an in-depth understanding of health services and operational systems.
