Guidelines for Visitors to Long-Term Care Facilities





All visitors must be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 to enter the facility*



All visitors must provide proof of full vaccination* against COVID-19 or a medical exemption to enter the facility



Visitors must take a rapid antigen test and receive a negative test result prior to visiting



During active COVID-19 outbreaks, social visits will be suspended. Essential and single designated visits will still be able to continue



All visitors are required to wear a medical mask in hallways, common areas and multiple occupancy rooms



Cough or sneeze into your elbow and do not touch your face



Clean hands before and after visiting



Use soap and water or alcohol-based hand sanitizer

*Excluding children under 12 years of age, those with an approved medical exemption or for an end-of-life visit

Guidelines for Visitors to Seniors' Assisted Living Facilities



DO NOT ENTER IF SICK





All visitors must be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 to enter the facility*



All visitors are required to wear a medical mask in hallways, common areas and multiple occupancy rooms



All visitors must provide acceptable proof of COVID-19 vaccination or a medical exemption



During active COVID-19 outbreaks, social visits will be suspended. Visits from single designated visitors will still be able to continue



Cough or sneeze into your elbow and do not touch your face



Clean hands before and after visiting



Use soap and water or alcohol-based hand sanitizer

*Excluding children under 12 years of age, those with an approved medical exemption or for an end-of-life visit
