#### Spring Boosters for Long-Term Care & Novavax Coming Soon

This week Dr. Bonnie Henry shared that British Columbia (BC) is rolling out fourth doses of COVID-19 vaccine for seniors over 70, Indigenous people aged 55 and older, and those who are considered clinically extremely vulnerable. The <u>booster program</u> is aimed at the highest risk groups who are now six months since their first booster shot (third dose), and who may be experiencing waning protection, especially from the Omicron variant. Spring boosters are being offered to residents in long-term care and assisted living care homes starting this week. Vaccines being offered include Pfizer and Moderna.

Dr. Henry also shared that Novavax is expected to arrive in BC later this week or early next, and will provide an alternative to the mRNA vaccines. She reiterated that the best protection against serious illness or death is to be up-todate on your vaccines, and urged anyone due for a booster in <u>any age group to receive a booster dose</u>. She also confirmed that BC will no longer require vaccine cards to be shown at public venues starting April 8, though businesses can keep requiring proof of vaccination if they wish.

On behalf of everyone at Island Health, we would like to express our gratitude for your partnership and support of the COVID-19 pandemic response. The mass immunization effort was both complex and challenging. The support of primary care providers in the community has been essential to the successful rollout of the life-saving vaccine. This week Dr. Henry talked about new modelling that is showing the overall pandemic situation is much better now than it was a few months ago, despite a small increase in hospitalizations in the past few days. Thank you for helping make the Island Health region one of the most vaccinated jurisdictions in the world.
