### July 28, 2021 – Big Summer Push with the VaxforBC Campaign

Yesterday, Dr. Penny Ballem, Executive Lead for B.C.'s immunization effort, joined Dr. Bonnie Henry and Health Minister Adrian Dix in sharing her gratitude to the millions of British Columbians who have stepped up and received a vaccination against COVID-19 over the past eight months.

To make it easier for people to protect themselves and their loved ones against COVID-19 – and to encourage more people to get vaccinated before school begins and the weather pushes us back indoors – the province introduced a 2-week <u>VaxforBC campaign</u>. The campaign is highlighting unique ways for people to get vaccinated, such as Island Health's <u>Easy Access Clinics and custom Vax Van</u>, which are helping to reach people right in their community.



On August 4<sup>th</sup>, all health authorities will be hosting <u>Walk-In Wednesday</u> at <u>mass</u> <u>immunization clinics</u>. While dose-1 walk-ins have been welcome at all clinics for several weeks, Walk-in Wednesday will be a special day where people can walk in without an appointment to receive their first dose **or** their second dose as long as they were vaccinated before June 16<sup>th</sup>, 2021.

Planning is also underway to scale down the mass immunization effort. Island Health will be moving towards a smaller, ongoing campaign to support the small portion of the population who have not yet taken advantage of the vaccination opportunity. The bulk of this work will happen at the end of August, but not before a final push to encourage as many people as possible to take advantage of our many easy-to-access, local clinics. On this BC Day long weekend, as you spend

time with friends, family, and patients, please share this information with those who may not be fully vaccinated yet. Now is the time to get it done to ensure good protection from COVID-19 as we head into the fall.
