



### September 29, 2021 – New Booster Doses & COVID Cases in Youth

Provincial Health Officer Dr. Bonnie Henry <u>shared a presentation</u> yesterday on how well vaccinations are working, and plans for booster doses of vaccine. For the majority of people, two doses are providing excellent protection, including against the Delta variant. This includes those who had a mix of two different vaccines.

Dr. Henry says starting next week, BC will begin offering booster doses to residents in long-term care, in conjunction with providing immunization against influenza. She says the data shows timing of this booster dose should be six months after the second dose. Her announcement coincides with yesterday's <u>recommendation</u> from the National Advisory Council on Immunization (NACI) that offering a booster dose to long-term care residents will help to enhance protection and prevent outbreaks.

Yesterday's briefing also shared that there's been a dramatic increase in COVID-19 cases among school-aged children, particularly in areas of the province with lower vaccination rates. The modelling presentation showed 1,086 cases involving people under the age of 18 in the week ending September 23<sup>rd</sup>. Island Health and other health authorities are again <u>posting school exposure</u> notifications on our websites, if COVID-positive staff or students attended school during their infectious period.

As you are aware, on September 13, 2021 Dr. Henry announced all health sector employees (including contracted service providers, contracted suppliers and volunteers working within the public health system) will be required to be fully vaccinated (two doses) against COVID-19 by October 26, 2021. The PHO Order in support of the September 13<sup>th</sup> decision, with specific details, is expected to be issued in the coming days.
