COVID-19 Sixth Wave Hospitalizations Easing – June 1, 2022

The omicron BA.2 COVID-19 variant continues to be the most predominant strain impacting people in the Island Health region. Hospital admissions during the current sixth wave of COVID-19 are significantly lower than several weeks ago, with an average of 10 admission per day, and the majority of those hospitalizations being incidental, where COVID-19 was not the most significant reason for admittance. We are also experiencing fewer and less severe long term care facility outbreaks, and population waste-water samples for the Lower Mainland are showing steady improvement in reduction of disease.

BCCDC Monkey Pox Information Webpage

The new BCCDC webpage provide Information on Monkey Pox symptoms, laboratory testing and diagnosis, infection control precautions, treatment and notification/reporting requirements. For information, the Office of the PHO has posted a <u>Notice of Duty to Report</u> on Monkeypox on the <u>PHO public health links page</u>, under "health information". The College of Physicians and Surgeons have also shared it with their members.

- Special Note: Physicians working in the Island Health region in both the community and in Island Health facilities should first consult with Island Health microbiology, then if required, BCCDC microbiology.
- Monkey Pox cases world-wide are likely in the 1000s of cases, and the disease has become endemic to parts of Central and Western Africa. The first cases in Canada have recently been reported in Eastern regions of the country.
